Job Description

- Lead youth trainings with Volunteer Services Coordinator, including youth PL trainings
- Manage project aspect of April service day with CampFire Youth

- Ability and willingness to be innovative and stretch the limits of current Hands On project parameters.

During their service, members receive a modest living allowance, medical insurance, & loan forbearance. Upon successful completion of the term of service, eligible members receive an education award of \$1,000-\$4,725 which can be used to repay qualified student loans, for further education in an accredited institution of higher learning, vocational or for trade schools. The education award is taxed in the year that it is used.
